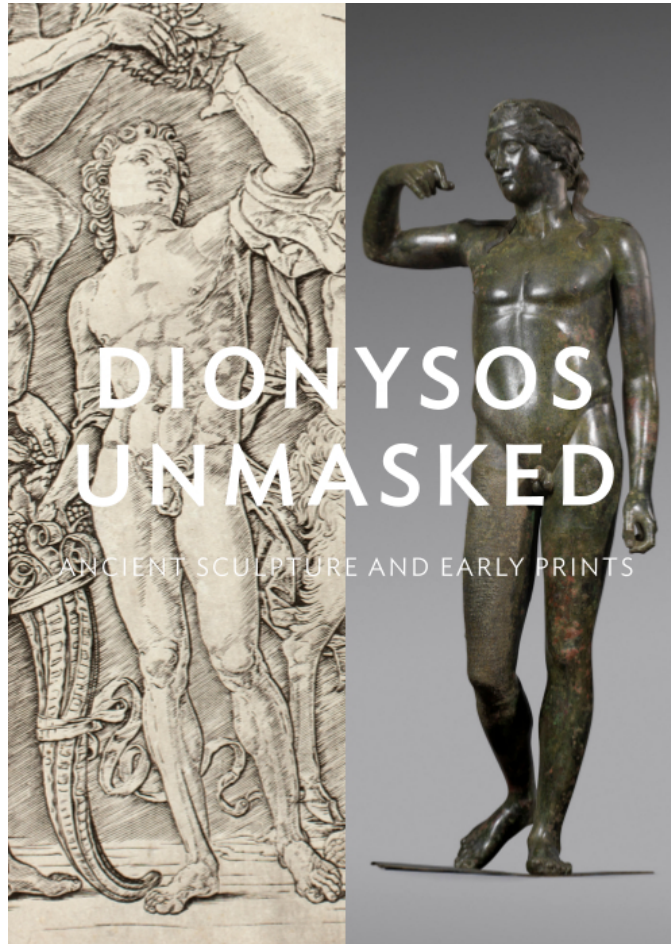


**Ancient Sculpture, Early Prints, Wreathed Lions...

**What:** After introductory remarks in the Library we will have a special curator's tour of the exhibit *Dionysos Unmasked*, a collaboration between the AIC's Departments of Ancient and Byzantine Art and Prints and Drawings. Co-sponsored by Caxtonian Shawn Donnelly the exhibit juxtaposes ancient sculpture with Renaissance and Baroque prints to bring new insights into the art of Classical antiquity and its many revivals.

**Dinner:** In the spirit of Dionysos, god of wine and theater, we will then proceed a short distance to a private dining room at Tavern on the Park for our own wine and drama over a three-course dinner consisting of:

Caesar Salad
